WORKS BY CONTEMPORARY ARTISTS



Featuring a selection of seventy-two works created between 1960 and 2011, the exhibition highlights art that includes text or refers to textual elements. Many of the works reflect developments in modern and contemporary art and critical theory, and relate to concurrent politics, history, and philosophy. Among the more than forty artists included in the exhibition are Alice Aycock, Trisha Brown, Jane Hammond, Jasper Johns, Sol LeWitt, Ed Ruscha, Karen Schiff, Cy Twombly, John Waters, and Lawrence Weiner.

The artworks in the exhibition are from the collection of Sally and Wynn Kramarsky, New York. Organized by the University of Richmond Museums, and curated by N. Elizabeth Schlatter, Deputy Director and Curator of Exhibitions, University Museums, with Rachel Nackman, Curator, The Kramarsky Collection. The exhibition and programming are made possible in part with the generous support of the University's Cultural Affairs Committee and funds from the Louis S. Booth Arts Fund.

The exhibition is on view at the Joel and Lila Harnett Museum of Art, University of Richmond Museums, from August 17 to October 16, 2011. It is accompanied by an online catalogue featuring images of all of the works in the exhibition, an essay by N. Elizabeth Schlatter, and entries contributed by University of Richmond alumni and students along with other artists, writers, curators, and critics.
